# CHAIRMAN OFFERS RESIGNATION

Supporters Trust Chairman John Bell has confirmed that he has offered his resignation from the Board of Directors, subject to other Directors accepting the transfer of his guarantee of £10,000. "This decision has not come easily. As someone who has followed Berwick Rangers for thirty years I have been particularly proud to hold the position of Director, and to represent the interests of other supporters through the Trust.

I have tried to carry out this role to the best of my ability, and it has been my hope that all parties associated with the Club, past and present, could be treated with fairness and decency, even where a difference of opinion exists. This has become increasingly difficult.

There are important, and potentially expensive, issues ahead that need to be resolved quickly for the good of Berwick Rangers. It would appear that the opportunity to resolve these issues amicably has now passed- time will tell if that is the case. I regret that the whole Board has perhaps not had the opportunity to contribute to these I very much hope that the Board will welcome another nominee from the Trust to serve as a Director, I also hope to carry on working through the Trust to achieve future stability and success for the Club, and I'd like to thank all those who have been so supportive, particularly so in recent weeks."

The Trust will be holding its next AGM sometime in January- date to be confirmed in local press. Trust members will be notified in writing if an extraordinary general meeting is to be held before the AGM.


